

WAEC PROTECTION PLAN UNDER COVID 19

From 31st December 2021

Version 13 (31st December 2021)

Valid from 31st December 2021 until further notice.

Initial situation

This protection plan is made to show how, within the framework of the updated protection measures established by the authorities since 20th November 2020, training and activities can be organised at the World Archery Excellence Centre.

In addition to the current Federal Council Ordinance COVID-19 and the Vaud Canton COVID-19 regulations on sports facilities and the practice of sport, the following principles must be respected.

- Compliance with the hygiene rules of the Federal Office of Public Health (FOPH)

- It is mandatory to register visitors to WAEC and participants in all activities to trace possible chains of infection.
- Persons, particularly at risk, must follow the specific prescriptions of the FOPH.

No sport without a plausible protection plan!

Following the protection plan of the Canton of Vaud and the City of Lausanne and Sports Facilities, each sports facility and/or any sport must develop a protection plan adapted to its training and the use of the facilities.

COVID Certificate from the 13th September 2021

From 13th September 2021, a COVID certificate will be required at the entrance to sports centres. This measure applies to people over 16 years of age and is limited to 24th January 2022. The Federal Council may repeal it sooner if the situation improves.

Indoor sports activities such as training and rehearsals will be restricted to persons with a COVID certificate.

Information obligation of sports clubs

It is the responsibility of sports clubs to ensure that :

- Trainers-instructors-coaches ;
- athletes ;
- visiting parents

... are informed in detail about the protection plan of their sport and their sports facilities, know the applicable protective measures, and strictly follow them. Coaches, athletes, and visitors are personally responsible for ensuring compliance with protective measures.

The Sports Department will draw attention to possible abuses and has the right to expel people from the establishment. In the event of a repeat offence, permission to use the sports facilities will be withdrawn immediately.

Note: the WAEC is not a club but has the responsibility as a sports centre to inform its members and users of the existing rules and ensure their implementation.

Who can use the World Archery Excellence Centre?

Sports clubs and user groups that have a protection plan confirmed by the FOPH and their respective federations. These must first obtain the written agreement from the WAEC.

- Active Members of WAEC.
- Swiss Archery - Member of national frame A (on written request)
- Any WAEC client sports group

1. Risk assessment and sorting

Anyone showing symptoms of infection is not allowed to enter the Centre and participate in any organised activity or training. Instead, this person must stay at home, contact their doctor, and follow their instructions.

As soon as a person takes a test and the results are positive for COVID 19, that person must immediately inform WAEC of their situation by e-mail to info@worldarcherycentre.org

They must inform us of their full name, telephone number, sport, and hours spent at the Centre during the 14 days before their confirmation of COVID 19.

If this person is a member of LUC Unihockey, Kyudo, COFOP, Rollerschool, Swissbasketball, Vaud Unihockey or EHL, the infected person must immediately report to their manager. The person in charge of the activity must also urgently inform the WAEC. As before, they must notify of their full name, telephone number, sport, and hours spent at the Centre during the 14 days before their confirmation of COVID 19.

2. COVID Certificate

- a. What is a covid certificate?

The COVID Certificate is a means of documenting a complete vaccination, a cured infection or a negative test. It is provided with a QR code and is available in paper or electronic form (via the COVID Certificate application).

To enter the centre, the covid "2G" or "2G+" certificate applies depending on the type of activity. This means that only people who have been vaccinated or cured of the disease will have access to the indoor facilities. In the case of "2G+", a negative test must also be presented. Exception: if your vaccination or cure certificate is less than 120 days old, then a negative test is not required.

- b. Who checks the covid certificate?

The covid certificate must be checked by the activity provider or the manager of a sports facility by scanning the QR code (via the COVID Certificate Check application) and by checking the identity of the person by means of an identity document with a photo (passport, identity card, driving licence, residence permit, student card, swisspass, etc.).

- c. Sports activity **with “2G +” COVID certificate**
- a. Control of “2G+” covid certificates and identity required
 - b. The “2G+” covid certificate is mandatory for spectators, trainers /instructors (also in children's sport)
 - c. External instructors hired by the WAEC must be in possession of the “2G+” Covid certificate
 - d. Seated consumption mandatory
- d. Sports activity **without a COVID certificate**
- a. **Outdoor sport only**
 - b. The indoor facilities necessary for outdoor practice (changing rooms and others) are accessible with a mask and a distance of 1.5m mandatory
- e. Sports activity **with “3G” covid certificate**
- a. Elite athletes who hold a Swiss Olympic national or regional performance passport or regional performance passport (Swiss Olympic Card) or are part of a national cadre of a national sports federation
 - b. Members of teams in a professional or semi-professional league or a national youth league

3. Wearing a mask

Wearing of a mask is mandatory in the common areas of the WAEC (corridors, hallways, changing rooms) for visitors and staff. It can be removed in the Easton hall and fitness area during practice. It must, however, be worn when moving around (e.g. fetching arrows, WC).

4. Hygiene

- a. The Centre recommends that everyone brings their own water bottle to limit the risk of contamination.
- b. Cleaning / disinfection :

Users and members are themselves responsible for cleaning and disinfecting the following items:

- Individual sports equipment used (bow, benches, goals, etc.)
 - Nico's corner (shooting sports), disinfection of current equipment before/after use.
 - Door handles and handrails are disinfected by WAEC staff several times a day. The toilets and sports floors used are cleaned regularly by WAEC staff.
- c. Hands must be thoroughly washed (or disinfected) before and after each training session.

5. Process of access and entry to the facilities :

The Centre's opening hours are:

Monday & Thursday	09h00 - 21h30
Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday	09h00 - 22h00
Saturday	09h00 - 21h00
Sunday	09h00 - 19h00

Access to the WAEC is by the main entrance (Except Uni-Hockey, which has its access to the Hall by using the ramp).

At the entrance, each visitor is asked to ring the bell /enter and present their "2G+" or "2G" covid certificate (depending on their activity), an identity document and to fill in an entry and exit from the entrance or use the MINDFUL app (QR code available at reception). In addition, each person will have to indicate their surname, first name, telephone number, date, time of arrival and departure. Clubs and other groups must keep track of the people present at each of their training sessions and provide this information (form) at the reception desk at the end of the activities.

Spectators, parents and accompanying persons are allowed to stay in the spectator stands if they are in possession of a covid certificate "2G+". Visitors, parents or spectators must register at the entrance of the Centre. It is compulsory to wear a mask at all times in the common areas.

6. Procedures for archery training - regulations

- a. A face mask must be worn indoors but may be removed in the Easton hall and fitness area during practice. It must, however, be worn when moving around (e.g. fetching arrows, WC).
- b. For other sports users, the details of their training sessions are defined by the protection concept issued by the corresponding sports federation.
- c. Archery equipment :
WAEC recommends that each archer uses their equipment. For those who use any of the Centre's equipment, please ask WAEC staff to lend it to you to make sure it was disinfected beforehand. Any person using WAEC equipment must keep it for itself, ensuring that it is not exchanged nor used by another person. Each archer is responsible for the management and use of its equipment. When the equipment is no longer needed, the user must return it to WAEC staff, who will ensure that it is disinfected and ready for another user.

Target pins are for single-use: each archer must take 4 of them (from the box of clean target pins) and keep them with them. The WAEC requests that each archer use their target pins when returning to train on other days. If the archer wishes to return used target pins, a container of "used target pins" is available. These will be disinfected regularly by WAEC staff.

7. Responsibility for on-site implementation

The organiser of any sports activity (club, association, or WAEC) is responsible for monitoring and controlling the implementation of the protective measures established by the WAEC and their respective sports federation. All must work and be responsible together for fighting against the coronavirus and keeping it from spreading.

In non-compliance with these guidelines, the WAEC will remind you of the obligation to comply with the regulations. In the event of a repeat offence, the WAEC has the right to temporarily exclude a member, a group, or a club from accessing and using the Centre.

8. Communication

This document is shared with the various WAEC users by e-mail and displayed at the Centre's entrance on the information board. It is also available on the website: www.worldarcherycentre.org

Clubs or associations using the Centre must inform and provide the WAEC Director with their sport-specific protective regulations. These will also be posted on the information board at the entrance.
